PLEASE NOTE: Due to the continuing threat to health caused by the Coronavirus epidemic, it is impossible to safely hold a gathering of shareholders. Instead of a gathering, the election this year will be by electronic and mail in ballots. How to participate:

<u>Proxy Holder</u>: The proxy form appoints a Proxy Committee as the proxy holder. The persons who are on the Proxy Committee are the members of the Board of Directors who are not running for re-election: Fred T. Angasan, Sr., Garith Nielsen, Terry Wassillie, Terry Mann, Shirley Nielsen and John Holm. If you give your proxy to the Proxy Committee, they will be responsible for seeing that your shares are voted in accordance with the proxy you have given them.

<u>Rescission of Proxy</u>: Your proxy can be revoked by a written revocation received by the Proxy Committee by the annual meeting date, by a subsequent electronic vote, or by filing a later-dated proxy before 1:00 p.m. on October 17, 2020.

Filing of Proxies: All proxies, revocations of proxies and powers of substitutions (hereinafter "proxy" or "proxies") shall be filed with **BDO**, whose address is 3601 C St., Suite 600, Anchorage, Alaska 99503 and fax number (907)278-5779. A proxy is not valid and may not be voted at the shareholder's meeting unless it is signed and filed not later than 1:00 p.m. on the 17th day of October, 2020.

In order to make your proxy valid, please date and sign it in <u>ink</u> exactly the way your name appears on the stock records. A person's mark shall constitute a valid signature if it is witnessed by two persons

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over 18 years of age. All proxies must be in writing. A proxy which shows an intent to empower or revoke a proxy or to substitute for a proxy shall be valid.

If a shareholder withholds authority to vote for all candidates, the proxy submitted by the shareholder will be used only for obtaining a quorum. If the shareholder votes for certain candidates, but fails to enumerate the number of shares to be voted for each candidate, the candidates indicated shall each receive the number of votes represented by the shareholder divided by the number of candidates voted for. If the shareholder votes for a candidate, but incorrectly enumerates the number of votes that he is entitled to vote, the votes shall be distributed to the candidate according to the same proportional share that was originally indicated by the shareholder.

Proxies received by the inspectors of election after closing of registration on the 17th day of October, 2020, shall be invalid unless a quorum does not exist on the day of the meeting, in which case, all proxies arriving after closing of registration on the 17th day of October, 2020 shall be counted. All challenges to proxies, ballots, or the conduct of the election or vote shall be made to the inspectors of election, who shall decide such challenge in accordance with the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of the Corporation and applicable principles of corporate law.

Electronic Voting: You may also vote electronically, utilizing the information contained in the flyer attached to and made a part of this proxy statement. To vote electronically, you must have access to the internet. Your votes will be recorded as you vote them. You may also revoke your electronic vote and revote. Please note: Electronic voting will be closed at 5 p.m. on October 16, 2020.

Board of Directors' Proxy Solicitation: Solicitations will be made on APC's webpage (https://www.alaskapeninsulacorp.com/), on APC's Facebook page, and by the use of the mail, except that directors, officers, or regular employees of Alaska Peninsula Corporation may make solicitations of proxies on behalf of the Board of Directors to obtain a quorum by telephone, facsimile machines or e-mail. In addition, radio, television and newspaper advertisements may be necessary to assist in the solicitation of proxies if deemed necessary in order to obtain a quorum. The cost of such solicitation will be borne by the Corporation.

Anticipated Costs of Solicitation: The total amount estimated to be spent by this Board solicitation is \$6,000. The total already expended on the solicitation of proxies is \$-0-. Excluding costs of postage, mailing, printing, fees or expenses for the election inspectors and election tabulators, and salaries and wages of regular employees, and possible expenses of telephone, facsimile, e-mail, other modes of communication, including print advertisements, all of which would normally be expended on the annual meeting in the absence of a quorum and in order that a quorum will be represented, no other expenses in connection with this proxy solicitation are anticipated.

Expenditures set forth herein include fees for attorneys, accountants, Great Originals, and expenses for advertising, printing, transportation, or other expenses incidental to the solicitation. The expense of this solicitation, including the cost of preparing, printing and mailing the notice of the meeting and proxy materials, and the cost of any supplemental mailing(s) will be borne by Alaska Peninsula Corporation.

<u>Legal Proceedings by Directors and Officers against APC</u>: No director or executive officer of the Corporation is involved in any legal proceedings as a party with interests adverse to the Corporation.

<u>Annual Report</u>: On or about June 24, 2020, all shareholders of record were mailed a reviewed financial statement prepared by BDO covering the operations of Alaska Peninsula Corporation for the period January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2019.

Independent Public Accountants

The Board authorized and approved all audit services performed by Alaska Peninsula Corporation's independent public accounting firm, BDO for Alaska Peninsula Corporation during the year ended December 31, 2019. BDO also performed non-audit services for the Corporation. These services included the preparation of federal and state corporate tax returns. A representative of BDO will be present at the annual meeting of shareholders and will be given the opportunity to make a statement.

BDO examined and reported on Alaska Peninsula Corporation's consolidated financial statements during the 2019 fiscal year. BDO also performed certain services not directly related to the audit function.

Fees: The percentage of the fees for all non-audit services of the total fees paid for both audit and non-audit services performed by BDO paid for by the Corporation was 12% for FY 2019.

Leadership Structure

Trefon Angasan, Jr., serves as Chairman of a nine member Board of Directors. The Board of Directors delegates management of APC and subsidiaries to David McAlister, who is APC's Executive Vice President and Chief Executive Officer and Brad Angasan is APC's President. Information concerning current Board members and membership of Board committees appears at Pages 5-9 of this Proxy Statement.

Election of Directors

Hybrid Open Electoral System: APC recently amended its Rules of Election to open opportunities to shareholders to seek nomination to the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors retains the discretion to nominate such persons as the Board, in the exercise of its business judgment, deems capable of acting as a director of the Corporation. The Board fully supports its nominees, designated below, and the Proxy Committee retains the discretion to vote discretionary votes in favor of the Board's nominees.

All information on the following tables of nominees and directors was supplied by the individual nominees and directors. Each director and nominee retains responsibility for the accuracy and completeness of the information the candidate provided to the Board.

How to Vote/Cumulative Voting: Holders of common stock of record on August 31, 2020 are entitled to vote at the Telephonic Annual Meeting October 17, 2020. As of that date, there are 898 shareholders of Alaska Peninsula Corporation entitled to vote at the annual meeting. Shareholders have the right to use cumulative voting in the election of directors, which means that each share of voting stock is

entitled to one vote for each director to be elected. Therefore, if you own 100 shares, you will have 300 votes (100 x 3) which you may cast entirely for one nominee or you may divide your votes as you choose among the various nominees. Each share of voting stock is entitled to one vote on each other issue that may properly come before the meeting.

Voting for the Board of Directors shall be by ballot. The names of all candidates who have been validly nominated shall be listed on the ballot. Persons holding proxies shall receive a ballot with the number of shares they are entitled to vote set forth on the ballot. The ballot shall be pre-marked to record the votes of the proxy holder as to which he or she has no discretion and shall indicate the number of additional votes as to which discretion is retained.

Voting Shares Held Under Custodianship: Alaska law requires that stock in a corporation organized pursuant to the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act belonging to a minor may be issued by the Corporation to a custodian who will hold the stock for the minor until he or she reaches the age of 18 years. By signing the Board of Directors' proxy, you will be granting a proxy with respect to both any shares owned by you in your own right and as custodian for each minor for whom you have been appointed.

Nominees: The three (3) nominees receiving the most votes shall be elected by plurality as directors. They shall be elected to three-year terms.
